



Introduction

An abstract is a brief summary of the paper you wish to present. An experienced team of peer reviewers (blinded to all author details) will assess your abstract for novelty/originality, professionalism, appropriateness and clarity of the methods, and significance/relevance to the field of paramedicine and the conference theme – ‘broadening horizons’.

Research abstract submission guidelines

Abstracts should include the following elements:

Title

TIP: Do not use cryptic or humorous titles. Keep the title succinct, professional and straightforward.

Introduction/Aims

TIP: Briefly describe the area of research and the purpose of the study including your research hypothesis/question.

Methods

TIP: Describe the research methodology used, data collection process, study population, recruitment targets, and data analysis.

Results

TIP: Briefly outline the results of your research.

Conclusions

TIP: What conclusions can be drawn from the research?

General notes

- Abstracts should be clear and succinct – do not include irrelevant information.
- Abstracts should conform to the above headings and word count (300 words).
- References are not required.
- Abstracts should be professional, paying particular attention to spelling and grammar.
- Do NOT include the author/s names or affiliations as part of the abstract text.
- Review your abstract before submission. Will someone with limited knowledge of the research understand the area of research, what you have tried to achieve, the way you conducted your research, the results of the research and the conclusions that can be drawn?
